MHNHS: What's New at Roxbury Crossing One Halleck Street

MHNHS has been working closely with our general contractor, NEI, to complete the construction of our second phase of affordable housing on Parcel 25, which is located across from the Roxbury Crossing MBTA stop. Despite many obstacles and challenges, MHNHS, NEI, and our management agent, Maloney Properties, worked tirelessly to finish and occupy Phase 2 before the end of the year. We are overjoyed to announce that Phase 2 (now to be known as One Halleck Street!) construction was completed in December and 46 families now call these affordable units home!

Occupying these units is another step toward achieving the community's vision of creating a multi-cultural, multi-aged, connected community at Roxbury Crossing. We look forward to meeting our new residents and enthusiastically welcome them to our community!

MHNHS: What Else is New at Roxbury Crossing Parcel 25, Phase 3

The good news at parcel 25 continues. Having completed Phase 2 (One Halleck Street) of the redevelopment of Parcel 25, MHNHS is now pursuing the development of the third and final phase of development at Parcel 25. The Phase 3 project (1R Gurney Street) was initially planned to be a 10-story office building but MHNHS has received approval from the Mission Hill Community and the BPDA through its notice of project change to build 94 homes instead. This change was approved by the BPDA and Boston Zoning Commission in December and January. Next, we go to State Executive Office of Housing and Livable Communities (EOHLC), to apply for additional critical funding before we can begin with the revised project. As always thank you to the Mission Hill community members for your letters and testimonies of support

MHNHS hopes this development will create a six-story building with 94 affordable rental units and 33 parking spots. Of these 94 units there are 24 one bedroom units, 55 two bedroom units, and 15 three bedroom units. 10% of these units will be set aside for extremely low income (ELI) homeless or formerly homeless individuals at our below 30% of area median income (AMI). An additional 10% will also be set aside for ELI families at or below 30% AMI. An additional 10% will be affordable at or below 50% AMI. 42 units will be affordable at or below 60% AMI. The remaining 23 units will be affordable to Workforce households at or below 80% AMI. All 94 units will be income averaged Low-Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC) units at or below 60% AMI in perpetuity.

Phase 3 development will also to increase opportunities for handicapped persons by including 15 units that will be accessible and include special adaptations. Specifically, 9 units will be fully accessible and 6 units will be fully adaptable. Of these units, 3 will include special controls and alarms for those with aural and/or visual impairments.

This project has an expected total development cost (TDC) of approximately \$55 million. MHNHS is pursuing funding through sources such as LIHTC, Executive Office of Housing and Economic Development, MassHousing Work Force funds, and City of Boston/Neighborhood Housing Trust to name a few.

Thank you so much to the neighbors, community organizations, and institutions who have supported this project by providing letters of support and testimony at the various community meetings regarding this project. The progress that has been made so far on Parcel 25 and what we plan to do in the future could not have been done without the support of the Mission Hill community.

The Coordinator will work with partner organizations and residents to educate the community about the initiative, conduct outreach, plan and carry out events, and support the Youth and Senior Advisory Council that will help oversee the initiative.
