# Announcing the Kevin W. Fitzgerald Park Arboretum!



With the assistance of the Northeastern

University Arboretum, Mission Hill NHS staff and past co-ops, and Mission Hill resident Ellen Moore, Mission Hill NHS submitted

an application for Kevin W. Fitzgerald Park to become a Level I arboretum. Arbnet, the designating authority, has accepted, so Kevin W. Fitzgerald Park is now an accredited arboretum. Going forward, the arboretum will be able to capture more public attention and spread awareness of the importance of sustainable green space and environmental conservation. We will keep working to add new native plants, reduce invasive species, and help our pollinators and greenery thrive!

Throughout the process of applying to make the Kevin W. Fitzgerald Park an accredited arboretum, Ellen has been an incredible asset, providing guidance and working hands on at the park.

Ellen's focus on the sustainability of the park has been wonderful, as she has emphasized the importance of native plants and reducing invasive plants in the park as well as the neighborhood in general. Ellen has acquired many native pollinator plants and seeds to plant in the park as well as in the retention basin. The retention basin has become an area to regulate water runoff as well as a haven for bees, butterflies, and birds as they eat and spread pollen. We are so grateful for Ellen's involvement in the park and for her advocacy in Mission Hill.
